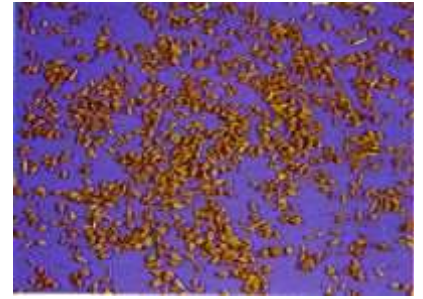


Plant Species**Accepted Name:** *Trachyspermum ammi* (L.) SPRAGUE**Family:** APIACEAE**Synonyms:**

Used in: Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, Folk, Sowa Rigpa, Chinese**Habit:** Herb**Distribution:** This species is native of Egypt and is cultivated in the Mediterranean region and in South-West Asian countries such as Iraq, Iran, Afghanistan and Pakistan, and mostly produced in India. Within India, It is cultivated throughout in the plains, but also grows well at higher altitudes. It is cultivated in Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, West Bengal, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh.**Common Uses**

The seeds of Yavani is used in the form of powder to treat worms. Appetiser: Yavani, sunthi, (zingiber officinale) patha (Cyclea peltata), pomegranate juice and jaggery mixed with salted buttermilk acts as carminative (CS.Ci.14.99) Colic, improves digestion Yavani, rocksalt, haritaki (terminalia chebula) and sunthi (zingiber officinale) -powder of these together in equal quantity alleviates colic and improves digestive power (VM.26.39)
